APFA Annual Report for Parish Meeting 25/4/16

Following last year's AGM, Ray & Margaret Lloyd resigned after 30 yrs + of unstinting support to APFA. Ray also resigned as a Trustee, but has kindly agreed to officially open the MUGA on 18 June.

Maintenance:

- Rolling program of inspection / PAT testing to comply with Insurance company requirements in place.
- Mice

- Electrics/plumbing
- Roof tiles, external woodwork treatment and bark around base of slide
- The rotten fencing along The Causeway has generously been replaced by Rand Contracting, including a gap to allow access for football retrieval & hopefully minimise future damage
- Dymott Builders are kindly going to repair the cladding on the pavilion

MUGA

- Sub-committee of Andy Theobald, Peter Smettem, Sian Miller, Kelvin White, Chris Pullin, Luke Jamieson, David Crwys-Williams and Kevin Nash have been very successful in securing approximately £98k funding from the following organisations:

- Safe & Sound Playgrounds commenced work on 13 April with an anticipated finish time in the next couple of weeks.
- Bench seating is also being installed to allow viewing of sport in the MUGA or on the football pitch.

Pavilion Hire

- Less activity this year despite regular advertising

Play Equipment

- The new double swing & rocking horse (funded from a successful Community Chest application and the proceeds of the Ashendon Race Night and Progressive Supper) are currently being installed (labour generously donated by Aylesbury Box Company)

Activities:

- Play Around the Parishes, organised via the Parish Council.
 - 3 dates throughout the year during the school holidays again proved very popular
- The inaugural Hundred Rounders Cup was held on 14 June. It was very well attended, with many surrounding villages entering teams (adult & children). Food & drink was supplied by The Hundred of Ashendon. Childrens' activities were very popular, and traditional afternoon tea & cakes went down a treat accompanied by The Marsh Gibbon Brass Band. A raffle provided minimal income but overall the whole day provided a fun time for all the family & competitive sports persons alike in an idyllic setting, raising the profile of this fabulous village amenity. We propose to make this a biannual event if there is sufficient support from the village.
- Conker championship / BBQ held in October – well attended and enjoyed by all ages
- Bonfire evening not held this year
- WI pancake races held in February but numbers were disappointingly low
- Ludgershall Football Club:
 - The club is well supported by family members & friends with the pavilion & play area providing a safe & fabulous resource for all. Various meetings are held in the pavilion throughout the year including the AGM & there is an annual social event also held on site for players, family & friends. Moles are a recurring nuisance with costs for treatments shared by the club & APFA. Great news hot off the pressthey achieved promotion on Saturday! They have purchased a memorial cup for their ex-manager & are seeking financial assistance to house it safely in the pavilion for display purposes.
 - The hot water supply proves insufficient supply if both home & away teams shower at once – options are being explored

Allotments

- 7 are currently let, at £25 each per year, remaining stable compared to last year
- More are available if wanted and have been advertised.
- All tenants are now on annual contracts & a general tidy up programme has been started. A second water butt is awaiting installation for use alongside the external tap which has now been fitted with a cut-off timer to minimise water loss.

Paddock

- Has benefitted from the year's + rest and will become available for rent again following completion of the MUGA works, though reparations to fencing will be required.

Insurance

- Cost is £840 this year.
